WORKING MEMBERS of the Society will shortly be given details of a trial scheme to rent to artists an area of wall space in the gallery for a stated period at a small fee. This is designed to accommodate those artist members who are not in a position to mount a one or two-man show. A trial exhibition of this kind is scheduled for mid-year and informal discussions concerning it will be possible at the artists' function already mentioned, Friday, April 10.

NEW GALLERY.

Patience must be one of our virtues but we feel we have now made real progress. Members will have seen recent newspaper reports stating that the Department of Justice is now ready to buy our Gallery and the site. Your Council confirms they have been officially advised of this. In our reply, we have said that we will be ready to recommend to our members that the Gallery be sold as soon as we receive a satisfactory reply from the Queen Elizabeth II Arts Council to our application for financial aid to cover the total estimated cost. About £35,000 will be needed in addition to the proceeds of the sale of the old Gallery. We have reason to believe that our application for financial aid will be considered as soon as the Arts' Council is appointed, and we expect this in the next few weeks.

We are watching for alternative sites. It is felt the area west of the River and bounded by say Montreal Street and Cranmer Square offers good potential, but there are, quite possibly, other sites. If Members are aware of any, we would appreciate the information.
