#### Paintings and Pastels 10 - 24 January 1978

"We have both lived at Mount Cook village for some years, and have become familiar with the seasonal and climatic changes amongst the high mountains.

In this group of pastels and paintings we have moved from the plains of the Mackenzie country across the mountains and glaciers to the sea of the West Coast. We consider the work shown to be still at the stage of studying and exploring the landscape forms and moods.

Climbing these mountains is a constant rush against weather and snow conditions. As a result, few people have time to explore the visual potential of snow and ice from the summits, dropping down over glaciers to the sea on the western side, and barren valleys and rolling tussock country in the East."

#### International Posters 25 January - 12 February

An exhibition from France on the theme 'The Right to Work.' It comes from the International Institute of Human Rights in Strasbourg and consists of original poster designs by artists from thirty countries.

All the posters were entries in a competition which the Human Rights Institute held this year (1977) in conjunction with its Sixth International Human Rights Film Festival.

The winners of the competition were: Gricha Gospodinov (Bulgaria) Jorge Fernandez (Cuba) and Tobor Helenyi (Hungary). On this occasion the prize monies were donated by the International Labour Organization. The posters were brought to New Zealand by UTA French Airlines.

# The arts and crafts of europe 4 May - 22 June

Dalgety Travel in association with Lufthansa Airlines are offering a fully escorted tour, with the accent on arts and crafts, leaving May 4 1978.

Friday May 26. Sestri Levante to Florence. By La Spezia, the marble quarries of Carrara, Pisa, and Vinci. (Leonardo's birthplace.)
