





PRINTMAKERS ZONTA INTERNATIONAL TOURING EXHIBITION

Celebrating the Suffrage Centennial 1993, this exhibition is a collaborative effort between Zonta and the 32 participating printmakers. The prints have been made especially for exhibition during suffrage year, with the women selected including both young emerging artists and established

printmakers.
The exhibition is touring throughout New Zealand and opened at the Fisher Gallery Auckland in May. It has stimulated a great deal of interest so far, and should prove to be an enlightening exhibition showing the great diversity of work produced by these women under the mantle of the term printmaking.
