

Alison Ryde

Alison Ryde is a third generation member of the Canterbury Society of Arts. Her aunt, Nancy Waller, also painted watercolours and exhibited at the CSA for many years in the 1930-50's.

Alison became a member of the CSA in 1960 while a student, and has strong memories of exhibitions in the Durham Street Gallery, particularly the black McCahon paintings and also the Hay's Prize. These were also the days of huge Woollaston paintings, and also of Doris Lusk and Olivia Spencer-Bower paintings.

She has been a Working Member since 1968, somewhat of a milestone when being invited to be a Working Member was a real achievement it seemed. She has shown watercolours in many Society shows over the years. Her first solo CSA exhibition was in 1981 with Kath von Tunzelmann in an adjacent gallery.

Several paintings from her solo shows were purchased for what was then the CSA permanent collection.

Alison has been on the CSA Council since 1982, being vice-president in more recent years.

Previously she was President of the Ashburton Society of Arts.

She is a serious professional painter mainly using watercolour, and has 2 or 3 solo shows each year, this year showing in France and Germany, and also as part of group shows in London and Hong Kong. Alison works from a studio-in-the-garden designed by fellow CSA Council member Kerry Mason. Husband David is Scientific Liaison Manager at Agresearch at Lincoln, and they have three grown children, of whom their son is also an artist.




