


JAMES WALLACE CHARITABLE ARTS TRUST Entry is open for emerging and mid career artists. The first prize is worth \$10,000 with two runner up awards of \$1,000 each. There is also \$13,000 allocated for the purchase of some finalists' work. The Awards are open to anyone working in the visual mediums of painting, photography or sculpture. 

MICHAEL DEAVOLL BEACONS

Beacons is the first solo exhibition by Geraldine sculptor Michael Deavoll, and is a collection of sculpture and drawings. It centres around the landforms and the seascape of Banks Peninsula, in particular the Christchurch estuary, Sumner and Scarborough. Mike recalls his experiences of the area; the surf, the naive wonder and awe he felt towards the area as a boy, and gives form to the idea of God as the spiritual force behind this landscape. The exhibition is designed to allow the viewer a link between loosely representational work and experimental media study in stone, steel, wire and wood.






CSA WORKING MEMBERS

CANTERBURY BRANCH AWARDS FOR ARCHITECTURE AND THE NZIA RESENE COLOUR AWARDS

The annual Canterbury Branch Awards raise public awareness of good architecture in our region of the country covering the top half of the South Island from Timaru to Nelson. Through acknowledging buildings, the awards reinforce the role that good architecture plays within the community, and increase awareness of the variety of work designed by NZIA architects. This year five awards have been given for a house, a school, a restaurant, activity centre structures in South Westland and new

apartments in a

heritage building, plus four colour awards.

Branch members participating in the awards programme submitted over thirty entries of their best work. The Colour Awards serve to recognize the impact of colour in design decisions and good examples of use of colour by architects.
