





ART NEW ZEALAND 1974 COMMONWEALTH GAMES EXHIBITION

The Commonwealth Games, the largest sporting event ever held in New Zealand, makes a wonderful opportunity to present to an international gathering what this country is achieving in the visual arts.


With the recommendations of Gallery directors throughout New Zealand the Council of the Society selected the best artists in the country, painters, printmakers, sculptors, potters, weavers, and jewellers, and invited them each to exhibit one work. The response from the artists has been excellent. Of the one hundred and twenty-six invited only four were unable for various reasons to exhibit. But more important the quality of the work submitted is of the very highest standard. Most artists are represented by major works, many breaking new ground. The end result is we believe an exhibition of the very best in the visual arts in New Zealand.

An exhibition of this scale has been costly to organise and stage, packing, printing, advertising, freight and so on and it could not have been held without the generous contribution of \$3,000 from the Queen Elizabeth II Arts Council and a financial backing in the event of loss from the Christchurch Arts Festival Committee.


