A MESSAGE FROM THE SELECTOR

In recent years New Zealanders have embraced the making of pots with incredible enthusiasm. At every exhibition new names appear on the list of exhibitors and fresh ideas are expressed.

The most important thing, however, if pottery is to continue to enjoy a climate in which to flourish, is to keep faith with those who like to buy our pots, by ensuring that only really good pieces are offered for sale. Exhibitions are our face to the public, and it is in our interest that those who buy should enjoy well shaped pots that function well, and are aesthetically satisfying. Pots must not leak or scratch furniture, and their construction should be true to the material from which they are made - that is, their forms should not be such as would be more suitably made in wood or metal.

Often when we make our first pots, in the thrill of opening the kiln, and handling the finished pieces, we are carried away by the sense of achievement, and immediately wish to share our efforts with others, without sufficient experience, or understanding or criteria of judgement.

A selector always has a difficult job, because it is necessary to set different standards for different occasions. In selecting for an exhibition at the national or international level, only the highest quality work can be picked out, because this exhibition is intended to show the very best that the whole of New Zealand can offer. In selecting the Canterbury Potters' Exhibition, however, I have tried to encourage some potters who have not yet reached the national level, but who are making pots of reasonable quality.

To those whose work has not been included I would say "Continue to practise and to look more critically at your own work". The chosen exhibitors should not be satisfied, and I hope that their Pottery continues to reach a higher standard.

New Zealand Potters have a distinct mission in helping to raise the standards of design and taste in the community, by making firstly good domestic ware which is pleasant to handle and use, because by handling pottery every day we come to appreciate it more and more, and our understanding and enjoyment of it grow.
